# Eastern Oklahoma MBCA Profiles by John Kushnerick

This is our fifth edition with Profiles of one long standing member and one recent new member. It is our hope that this encourages everyone to get to know our fellow members. We all need to realize it takes a long time and many experiences to get to know someone. These articles and all of the club activities are intended as opportunities to make long term friends.

## Dave Hinnant

### Tulsa OK

#### Member since May 1997

I dare say that there are very few people in Tulsa who have owned as many Mercedes Benz automobiles as Dave. During his lifetime he tells me he has owned about 17-20. Currently Dave owns a 1977 450sl, 1967 230 sedan, 1972 280sel 4.5, 1972 350sl, a 1966 200D station wagon and a 1990 Unimog military truck. This does not include the several others he has in parts or storage.



#### My first Mercedes Benz

Dave grew up in Tulsa. He acquired his first Mercedes when he offered to paint a neighbor's house in exchange for her car. The car was a 1961 220sb. "The lady needed her house painted and I needed a car". So Dave pulled out the ladder, scraped the old paint, and put a fresh coat on the house. The car needed a clutch and other fixes.

"I figured I needed to know how to fix my car so I went to work in late 1973 working for Siggie Grimm at his dealership at 2515 East 11th street. (Note: This was the location of the original Mercedes Benz/Studebaker dealership - Richardson Motors.) "We called the place the 'old lumberyard' since the building looked like one. I started by sweeping floors, running for parts, and anything they needed. I apprenticed under the two senior Mercedes Benz mechanics, Ed Garrott and Gerald Moore. I learned the ropes from them and after two years became a Technician." In 1976, the business moved a few blocks away to a new location at 2007 E 11th street. "I attended factory training and worked on repairs and alignments there till 1986." Dave then moved to Tristar Automotive in Tulsa till late 1996.

In mid 1997, Dave, Sid Overturf and Denny Holden pooled their tools, resources, and skills to open up Benzin Motor Works. "We started out small. We didn't even have a lift." With patience, skills, and a passionate customer base, the business grew. "Our slogan was: Just honest service with a personal touch."

In 2010 the business expanded to its current location on E 38<sup>th</sup> street. The shop now works on Mercedes, BMW and Hummer H1. Dave is **President / Parts Manager** but still works on the older cars. "We lost Sid in 2011". "His passing has left a big hole. We all miss him."

Dave went on to tell me stories about a few of his early Mercedes purchases after the 1961 220sb. One of the most interesting cars was a 1972 350sl. This was the first year of the R107 body style for USA. Dave and his wife used the car on their honeymoon driving out to the western and mountain states. He sold the car and bought the car back years later. It sits in storage waiting to be restored. His newest car is a 1977 450sl in Signal red. "This car is a project car. I have so far spent a fair amount of time and money on the car and keep working on it when I get a chance."

#### Dream Car

Dave's dream car is a car most would enjoy to look at but would be intimidated by its service. A 1965 300se sedan. "The car has the fin body, 4 door sedan, big chrome, air suspension and was the high end top of the line finback or 'heckflosse' sedans in 1965. I have always had a place in my heart for the 50's and 60's models." (see: <http://mercedes.heckflosse.nl/>)

A unique thing about Dave is that he is a drummer in a band. "We practice twice a week. We love Beatles and late 60's music". They play at parties and other occasions.

Dave was a member of the Mercedes club in the 1970's. "I was 21 years old in 1976. When I joined the club I was by far the youngest member. I lasted one year and then came back in 1997 when I was older."

With his busy 12 hour days in helping to run a business, Dave wishes he could participate more in club activities. But "Extra time is tough to come by".

"One thing I can say is that I have met a lot of nice people in this business. People come and go but if you do the right thing and are honest, you will build lasting relationships".

**John Ferrante**  
**Tulsa Oklahoma**

John was born and grew up in New York City. As a boy he could not wait to get his driver's license. At 16 and a half exactly, he had his learner's permit and on his 17th birthday; his driver's license. His first car was a 55 Chevy painted in Cadillac "Crimson Fire Mist" RED. Since John's dad owned a gas station, garage, and service station, he was exposed to cars and trucks and learned to drive long before he became legal. He also was mechanically inclined and felt he could fix anything. John was eager to learn and was fortunate to be mentored by a few experienced old time mechanics. He discovered the sport of drag racing, both on and off the track, and was fascinated with learning how to make cars go faster.



As time went on, John realized there was more money in aviation than in automobiles. He went back to school and received an Associate's Degree in Aviation Maintenance and later a Bachelor's Degree in Operational Management. He joined American Airlines in 1973 as an Avionics Technician. John and his wife of 45 years, Judy and 2 children moved to Tulsa in 1986 when John was promoted to Manager on Duty for Maintenance Operations at the Maintenance & Engineering Center. He retired from a 39+ year career as Director of Maintenance Operations.



**My First Mercedes**

About 11 years ago, John and his wife, Judy were in Las Vegas attending the SEMA Automotive Trade Show. On display was the new Saturn Sky convertible. Judy fell in love with the car and wanted to order it right then. As soon as they got back to Tulsa, they checked the Saturn dealership, but, they were told that since it was new, it was totally sold out at all Saturn dealerships. They drove across the street to Jackie Cooper and as fate would have it, Judy fulfilled her dream with a convertible in a 1999 silver SL500 and it had a removable hardtop for the winter! Since the original sticker price in 1999 was over \$100,000, John felt he was getting a bargain. They love to take the convertible along the Talimena Scenic drive with the top down and the heat blasting to see the fall colors!

John has his own toy, a 2001 ZO6 Corvette. John actually helped build the car along the assembly line in Bowling Green, Kentucky.

**Dream Car**

If John could own any car, it would be a brand new S class AMG sedan with a twin turbo V12. It has no remorse for carbon credits, "Style with Speed – Need I say More?"

John is happy to be retired. "I worked like crazy all my life. I can even remember my first day at AA. It goes by so fast." He keeps busy on the board of Tulsa Air & Space Museum. From my conversations with John, his personal pet project is working with a small but dedicated group of retired AAs that have been working since 2009 on restoring a DC3 aircraft that was once flown by American Airlines as the "Flagship Tulsa". The restored forward fuselage and cockpit will find its' home in the museum.

# Election of New Board Members

It is time for our Section to elect New Board Members and then for the Board Members to elect Officers to make up the Executive Committee and also to select the Chairs for all of the Committees that make up the Board of Directors. We also need some new Directors-at-Large that serve on the Board.

The following was taken from the Mercedes-Benz Club of America Section Leadership Guide published on the Web Site.

I thought this information might be helpful as we head into the next year.

## 1. Board Roles & Responsibilities

### General Responsibilities of All Directors

1. Attend all meetings of the Board of Directors and of the Executive Committee (according to their level of responsibility in the section).
2. Carry out all responsibilities as defined below, directly, or by delegating in their absence.
3. Complete all required reporting as defined below.

NOTE: If an Officer, Executive Committee member, or Director is unable to fulfill their responsibilities as defined, the President may assign a replacement after conferring with the person about their situation. A replacement Director is typically approved by the full Board of Directors—even if after the fact. If an Officer is unable to fulfill his or her responsibilities, the Executive Committee will follow the *Section Bylaws* to arrange for a replacement.

### Executive Committee

1. Consists of the President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer and Immediate Past President (Ex-Officio). The President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer are the Officers of the Section.
2. May invite the Regional Director to participate in an advisory capacity.
3. Acts as a Steering Committee to advise the President, makes policy decisions, and is responsible for the legal and financial aspects of the Section.
4. May call a meeting of the Executive Committee when needed or in accordance with the *Section Bylaws*.
5. May also meet independently of the Board of Directors.

### President

1. Calls meetings of the Executive Committee (as needed) and of the Board of Directors.
2. Is responsible for carrying out the Bylaws of the Section and complying with National MBCA Bylaws and operating requirements.
3. Is chairperson of the Executive Committee, Board of Directors, and an ex-officio member of all section committees
4. Is the Chief Administrator of the Section
5. Is responsible to the Executive Committee.

### Vice President

1. Handles the duties of the President when necessary.
2. Carries out any other duties requested by the President.
3. Acts as a resource to the Activities Chair, when requested.
4. Is responsible to the Executive Committee.

### Secretary

1. Records and maintains minutes of all Executive Committee and Board of Directors meetings.
2. Distributes minutes of all meetings within a specific number of (i.e. 10, 20, etc.) days:
  - Executive Committee minutes are distributed only to the Executive Committee
  - Board of Directors minutes are distributed to everyone on the Board of Directors
3. Fulfills other secretarial duties as requested by the President.
4. Is responsible to the Executive Committee.

### Treasurer

1. Records all receipts of money and pays all section expenses approved by both the Treasurer and the President.
2. Assures that checks for payment of expenses are available at each section activity.
3. Maintains and balances all bank accounts using Generally Accepted Accounting Principles.
4. Files all required tax reports, statements, and non-profit reporting requirements on or before their due dates.
5. Files all required reports to MBCA National Business Office as needed or requested.
6. Assigns and maintains itemized accounts by major areas (i.e., activities, advertising, section newsletter and web site, etc.).
7. Assists Activities Director and Activity Chairpersons in financial planning and reporting of their events.
8. Prepares written financial reports and presents at all Board of Directors meetings.
9. Is responsible to the Executive Committee.

### Immediate Past President (Ex-Officio)

1. Advises the President and Executive Committee about the policies and practices of the section and MBCA as requested or required.
2. Is an ex-officio member of the Executive Committee and the Board of Directors.
3. Chairs the Nominating Committee.
4. Is responsible to the Executive Committee.

## Board of Directors

Chairs of the committees are appointed by the President and confirmed by a majority of the members of the Board of Directors.

## Activities

1. Develops and maintains a running twelve-month calendar of activities/events, in four categories: Social, Driving, Technical, and Educational.
2. Captures requests from members for activities/events.
3. Presents updates on activities/events to the Board of Directors at all meetings and seeks approval of any special consideration (i.e. unusual expenses, etc).
4. Seeks interested activities/events coordinators and assigns coordinators for other events.
5. Works with the Technical Chair to coordinate and schedule Technical Sessions.
6. Reviews budgets and processes for managing events with Coordinators prior to their events.
7. Works with Event Coordinators to handle event announcements and submission of articles (with reservation form if required) to the Editor of the newsletter (at least two months prior to each event, if possible). Gives a copy of the section's *Guide for Event Hosts* to each event coordinator prior to event planning.
8. Develops new and interesting activities.
9. Invites other regional sections when appropriate.
10. Prepares activities/events coordinators to run their event, including registration, lists of paid and unpaid participants, logistics, arranging for help at activities/events, etc.
11. Ensures that the Editor receives a write-up with photos (if possible) immediately after each activity/event from the Coordinator, an activity/event participant, or the Activities Chair prior to the next deadline of the newsletter.
12. Seeks assistance when necessary and stays in touch with the Vice-President.
13. Is responsible to the Board of Directors.

## Editor (Newsletter)

1. Coordinates write-ups of events/activities and other articles from those responsible.
2. Reviews and edits all material for publication.
3. Prioritizes information to be published in the newsletter:
  - a. Section news, events, activities, President's/Officer's Message, 12-month calendar.
  - b. Directory of Officers, Executive Committee, and Board of Directors.
  - c. Regional and national events.
  - d. MBCA events, news.
  - e. Other region's events.
  - f. Trading Post, Technical items, etc.
  - g. Feature Mercedes-Benz articles.
  - h. Advertising allotment (coordinate with Advertising Chair).

- i. Feature articles on advertisers (coordinate with Advertising Chair).
4. Publishes and distributes the newsletter by the 1st of each month (or whatever publication cycle you have).
5. Sends files to the Webmaster for posting on the section website.
6. Submits future section events to the Editor of MBCA's *The Star* for publication.
7. Submits reports (and photos if possible) of recent section events to the Editor of MBCA's *The Star* for publication.
8. Sends a copy of each newsletter to the section historian, the MBCA National Office, the Regional Director, National Directors-at-Large, *The Star* editor, Presidents and Editors of other regional sections, and others as appropriate.
9. May recommend an Associate Editor to the Executive Committee for approval (to assume responsibilities in the absence of the Editor and/or to assist the Editor as needed).
10. Reviews any concerns or issues with the President.
11. Is responsible to the Board of Directors.

## Membership

1. Downloads membership records from the NBO FTP site, and reports membership statistics to the board.
2. Keeps membership roster locally (including new members, transfers in/out, expirations).
3. Provides Editor with updated addresses, changes, etc.
4. Sends welcoming letters to new members informing them of your section.
5. Develops a membership recruitment program (such as working with local Mercedes-Benz dealers, newsletter advertisers, and section member referrals).
6. Is responsible to the Board of Directors.

## Website (Webmaster)

1. Develops then updates the section web site on a periodic basis.
2. Coordinates content with the Newsletter Editor, Advertising Chair, and other board members.
3. Is responsible to the Board of Directors.

## Directors-at Large (maximum number determined by section by-laws)

1. Become section DAL first to determine if and where each may have an interest in becoming a committee chair or an officer. The goal is to have each DAL move into a leadership position (committee chair or officer) within a year or two—to actively rotate from a DAL to a committee chair or officer.
2. Assist with section activities and events as requested by the President or other Directors.
3. Are responsible to the Board of Directors.
